## Pats trample Bills for 10th win in a row

ORCHARD PARK, N.Y. — Somewhere, Pete Rozelle must be spinning in his grave.

The longtime late NFL commissioner worked throughout his career to make sure that there would always be parity in the league, that at the start of each season and on any given Sunday, every team would have a chance to win.

And this year, the New England Patriots are making a mockery of Rozelle's life work.

Making everything look easy from the opening snap, the Patriots returned to their dominating ways against the Buffalo Bills, tying the team record for points in a 56-10 embarrassment of their AFC East foe.

New England needed 60 minutes to edge Indianapolis two weeks ago, but last night it took all of five plays to announce their intentions against Buffalo: to score often, and to score at will.

The Bills were without rookie running back Marshawn Lynch because of an ankle injury, and lacking their leading rusher, Buffalo became one-dimensional, putting the game almost squarely on the (shaky) right arm of quarterback JP Losman.

Losman found Lee Evans for a 16-yard gain on the first snap of the game, but then was dropped for a nine-yard loss by Adalius Thomas. On second-and-19, Losman dropped back, looked downfield for Josh Reed — and found Randall Gay instead.

Gay returned his third interception of the season 21 yards, and New England had 15 more tacked on after that when Bills offensive lineman Langston Walker shoved Gay after he had gotten out of bounds.

Starting at the Buffalo 13, Tom Brady hit Jabar Gaffney for a seven-yard

DAYTONA BEACH, Fla. — As about 30 Rhode Island fans chanted "U-R-I" in a near-empty gym, it was time for Will Daniels to check something off his mental list.

Glenn Wilkes Classic? Check.

Three more championships to go.

Rhode Island's 74-69 win yesterday over the University of Alabama-Birmingham was the first of four championships Daniels says Rhode Island is eyeing. Next up is the Islander In-

vitational late next month, the Atlantic 10 Championship and, of course, the NCAA Tournament.

Lofty goals, but a 3-0 weekend in Daytona is a good start.

"This is something we planned out at the beginning of the season," said Daniels, whose Rams are 5-0. "We've got a long way to go."

With the preseason motivation out of the way, Daniels sent a message of his own to UAB in the form of seven

## Hurricanes heat up in second half as Friars go cold at free-throw line

SAN JUAN, Puerto Rico — After seeing Providence College Temple and Arkansas with its zone defense over the last few days, Miami coach Frank Haith thought he had some answers for last night's championship game of the Puerto Rico Tip-Off tournament.

It took Haith and his Miami Hurricanes a little longer than they'd hoped, but a second-half offensive spurt led to 58-percent shooting and that added up to just enough of a

spark for the 'Canes to squeeze out a 64-58 win.

James Dews led Miami with 17 points, and Brian Asbury hit several big shots late in the game and finished with 16.

"In the first half, we were not attacking and their zone pushed us so far out," said Haith, whose team is now 4-0. "We had to squeeze their zone."

In the second half, we were able to get into the middle of the zone and that was the key."
