Group Work in the Classroom: Definition, Benefits ...

There are four stages of group work. First, the instructor must decide that he/she wants to incorporate group work into the class. The group work should be designed into the syllabus. The second stage involves teaching the students to work in a group. Instructors cannot assume that students know how to work together, structure time, and delegate tasks.
