


AFFIDAVIT OF TODD J. BARRY

My name is Todd J. Barry. My date of birth is 11/23/56. I am writing this statement to admit my involvment in the death of Victoria Cushman, I met Vicky at the Hot Club in the summer of 1988. We had an on/off relationship in the year prior to her death. Our relationship was mostly just sexual but we were also friendly. At the time Vicky was living on Waterman St.

in Providence. She would often call me and i would go over to her place. This relationship lasted a few months and then drifted apart. I would see her from time to time around

Providence. At some point she told me she was working at the Alpine Ski Shop in Warwick and showed me her apartment. During this time period, she told me she was dating a Warwick

police man.

- On the day Vicki died i remember going to the Hot Club around 5pm and meeting some friends. To the best of my recollection I had at least 5 beers and several shots of
hard liquor.

I remember leaving the Hot Club with friends between 8 or 9pm. and going to a club on Richmond St., that I think was Club Rocket. The club was loud and crowded. I recall drinking at least 3 or 4 more beers. After that I switched to a hard liquor drink which I do not recall. At this point my memory becomes hazy due to the amount of alcohol I had consumed. I continued to drink these drinks for the rest of the night. At one point I recall being outside smoking what I thought was pot with people. I went back into the club. The next thing I remember is a wave of disorientation. Something dramatic happened and my mental state became very unstable. My heart was pounding, I began sweating and my mind was racing uncontrollably. My prior experience with pot on alcohol had never given me this reaction. Either what I smoked was not pot or was laced with another drug, or my ... I ... smoked with another drug. T.B.

I became AFRAID AND PANICKY AND KNEW
I HAD TO LEAVE THE CLUB. MY MEMORY IS
INCOMPLETE AND FRAGMENTED FROM THIS
POINT ON, I JUST REMEMBER BEING OUT OF CONTROL.
- THE NEXT THING I REMEMBER IS DRIVING
95 SO. TOWARDS HOME. THE NEXT THING I
REMEMBER IS BEING AT VICKY'S APARTMENT. I
HAD NO INTENT OF HARMING VICKY OR
HAVING SEX WITH HER. I REMEMBER TALKING
WITH HER IN THE APARTMENT FOR A LITTLE WHILE,
BUT I DON'T REMEMBER HOW LONG. AT ONE POINT
I ~~REMEMBER~~ REMEMBER STUMBLING TO THE FLOOR AND
VICKY HELPING ME UP. I REMEMBER BITS AND
PIECES OF OUR CONVERSATION. SHE MENTIONED
HER RELATIONSHIP WITH THE POLICEMAN.
SHE MENTIONED SOMETHING TO THE EFFECT
~~THAT~~ THAT HE WAS GOING TO LEAVE HIS
WIFE AND KIDS AND BE WITH HER. I THINK
I TOLD HER SHE WAS FOOLING HERSELF AND HE
WAS NEVER GOING TO LEAVE HIS FAMILY. I
THINK SHE WAS MAD THAT I SAID THAT.
I CAN ALSO REMEMBER HER SAYING I
LET HER CRASH AND SHE WAS GOING TO
SEE ME.

I recall the conversation getting tense. I don't know exactly what triggered it but I remember being overcome with what I can only describe as uncontrollable rage. I honestly have no idea what caused this, but I believe it was the drugs and alcohol. The next thing I remember was hitting Vicki in the head with what I believe was a fire extinguisher, and she was on the floor. I was horrified and in shock and left the apartment. For over thirteen years I have been living in fear, sorrow, guilt and mental suppression over the death of Vicki Cushman. I always thought I was going to be questioned immediately after her death. That never happened. I was very much in a state of denial and confusion. I could not live with myself any longer and had to turn myself over to the authorities. I am deeply sorry for Vicki's death and the Cushman family's tragic loss. I am also deeply sorry for the loss caused by Scott Horvoff and his family.

I hope that this admission will begin the healing process ~~can~~ for the pain caused by the horrific acts of the past. I would also like to sincerely apologize to the pain I have caused my family. I would like everyone concerned to know that drugs and alcohol twisted my perception on that night beyond my control.

- I have made this statement voluntarily and knowingly. It is my intent that my attorney's deliver this statement to the Rhode Island Dept. of Attorney General. I will make myself available to surrender to any designated law enforcement agency.
